PM inaugurates Monoharganj UP Complex & Chandina-Eliotganj-Krishnapur Road in Comilla

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina assured the enclave inhabitants of Dahagram and Angorpota that her government would take some measures to improve the Monoharganj UP Bhaban, a four-storeyed building with a total floor area of 38000 square feet, has been constructed by LGED at a cost of Taka 8.21 crore. The entire cost has been funded by the Government of Bangladesh.

Monoharganj Upazila, with an area of 166 square kilometers, has a total population of 1,18,918 in 164 villages under 11 unions. The newly constructed UP Bhaban is expected to render essential services to the people of the upazila with improved infrastructural facilities. This is a manifestation of the successful implementation of the Prime Minister's promised commitment.

Chandina-Eliotganj-Krishnapur Road (chai-nage 00-6705 meters) has been constructed in Chandina Upazila in Comilla district by LGED

under Second Rural Infrastructure Improvement Project (RIIP-II). Funded by ADB, KfW, DFID, GiZ and GoB, the 6.73 kilometer long road has been constructed at a cost of Taka 5.62 crore. The prime objectives behind construction of Chandina-Eliotganj-Krishnapur Road are to create an unhindered road communication network, minimize travel time and travel cost and marketize locally produced agricultural and fisheries commodities.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina also laid the foundation stone of construction of the extended building of Nangolkot Upazila Parishad Complex the same day. Funded solely by the Government, this on-going project will be implemented by LGED and Nangolkot Upazila Parishad jointly at an estimated cost of Taka 4.54 crore. The total floor area of the Complex Bhaban is 21000 square feet. The building has to be provided with rain water harvesting and solar panel electricity technologies.

Editor's Note

ICT gaining ground in LGED

LGED has been continuously striving to enhance the capacity building for service delivery by using ICT tools. As a part of this strategy, a huge training program on ICT for human development has been scheduled and that is progressing well. So far 150 Engineers and Assistant Engineers and Senior Assistant Engineers have been completed the training. This program would continue till all the Engineers of LGED are trained. The online tendering is another e-government activities in which LGED is moving forward to bring transparency, accountability and efficiency in procurement process. More than 700 Engineers have so far been given training on e-GP (electronic government procurement) in the positions from Project Director to Assistant Engineer. Throughout the entire country, 100 packages of tender under LGED have been invited through e-GP system. In the next financial year, the e-GP would be rolled out up to Upazila level covering at least 1400 tender packages.

The GIS unit is currently developing cyclone shelter thematic maps for 14 coastal areas under World Bank financed ECRR Project. These maps will be used to plan and implement safe shelters for the coastal people during floods and cyclones. There is a collaborative work going on with LGED, IRRI, BWDB, SRDI and IWM for the development of agriculture and aquaculture system in the coastal area for food security. The objectives of these activities are reducing poverty; improving food security and strengthening livelihood resilience in the coastal area through improved water governance and management and more productive and diversified firm system. The providing baseline Unit geo-information and analytical support to develop the tools.

PM inaugurates 480-meter bridge on Dhaleswari-1 river in Munshiganj

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated a 480-meter prestressed concrete girder bridge on the river Dhaleswari-1 in Munshiganj district on 28 May 2013. Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) completed the construction of the said bridge at a cost of Tk. 25.19 crore, funded by the Government of Bangladesh, within the stipulated time-frame of six years divided in three distinctive phases. With the construction of the bridge on Betoka-Teghoria road, a vast majority of people living in Munshiganj Sadar, Tongibari and Serajdikhan upazilas of Munshiganj district are set to enjoy cost-effective and

time-saving communication and transportation facilities with Dhaka city. The distance between Munshiganj and southern part of Dhaka city now stands shortened by 40 kilometers.
