### Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurates digitised information & service centres for all unions

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said setting up Union Information and Service Centres (UISC) across the country will accelerate the government efforts to build up a knowledge based digitally advanced nation by 2021. She said this while inaugurating UISC in all 4,451 unions of the country simultaneously through video conferencing with UNDP Administrator and former New Zealand Prime Minister Helen Clark, people of remote Kukrimukri in Bhola district and State Minister for Science and ICT Architect Yeafesh Osmany in Jashodal union of Kishorganj district on November 11, 2010. The Prime Minister termed the launching of the Information and Service Centre as an epoch making step towards bringing information services to the door steps of all citizens of the country. She also said, an educated and self-reliant nation is the prerequisite for this. Referring to the inauguration of the Service Centre at union levels, the Prime Minister said the project has been taken up to make the Union Council a knowledge-based institution.

Digital Bangladesh will be free from technology deficit for all the citizens irrespective of rich or poor, educated or illiterate, she said. In this connection Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina listed a number of programmes taken up by her government including the launch of a District Web Portal, Digital Innovation Fair, Workshop on Digital Bangladesh for the Upazila Chairmen and setting up computer lab and education equipment in Teachers' Training College.

It is worthwhile to mention here that LGED is moving forward to transform its activities towards ICT based platform. The Local Government infrastructure database has been developed for the whole country through GIS technology. The piloting of disaster damaged infrastructure database for twenty five upazilas is going on. The procurement process of LGED is going to be reshaped as ICT based system very soon. All maps, database, reports and publications would be up-loaded into LGED's expanded web portal very soon.

# Editor's Note

### **Training in LGED**

Training is a Systematic process to develop knowledge, skill and attitude to attain the goal of an organization. There is no alternative of training in orienting people with modern and latest technology. It is the oldest art and newest science. Normally, people acquire knowledge in a particular discipline and enter into services. Job field can't be addressed adequately with mere academic knowledge gained from formal educational institutes. People always need additional orientation or training to be fully acquainted with a job concerned. Technology is developing fast. Concerned people need to cope up with the latest technology. Training is the only tool that enables people to cope up with latest technology.

As an organization LGED always emphasizes on training. Training in LGED began in 1982 under erstwhile Works Programme Wing. A Central Training Unit (CTU) at LGED Head Quarter Dhaka and 10 Regional Training Centres were later set-up under LGED in 1998. LGED Training system is decentralized. All the 64 districts and 482 upazilas are covered through 10 Regional Training Centres. It does not mean that training programmes are arranged only at HQ and regional levels. Trainings are also held at district, upazila and union levels depending on the target groups and the types of training. All categories of employees, LGI representatives, contractors and project beneficiaries are covered under training programmes. Effectiveness of training is measured after certain interval by external agents. Training is funded from development projects as well as from GOB revenue budget.

The overall objective of LGED Training Unit is to develop capacity of LGED Officials and staff through development of overall training policy, assessment of training need and preparation of annual training plan, development of training modules, implementation and evaluation of training courses. LGED Training Unit develops inhouse trainers through Training of Trainers (TOT) course.

During the last two decades, LGED has expanded a lot. The image of LGED has also been upgraded at national and international level. Training is one of the important factors behind these.

He said, 131 Upazila Engineers have been employed recently who are working with local government bodies as important agents of change at the grassroot levels. He said, they would be given monthwise targets to construct and reconstruct primary schools at the upazila level and it is hoped that they would successfully complete that. He also hoped to say that the field-level engineers of LGED would be able to identify themselves as true catalysts for a change to improve the lot of the people.

# MOU signed between LGED and GTZ on slaughterhouse-based biogas plant

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been signed between LGED and GTZ for disseminating slaughterhouse-based biogas plants in Bangladesh on 08 November 2010. Mr. Md. Wahidur Rahman, Chief Engineer, LGED and Mr. Erich Ottogomm, Program Coordinator, GTZ signed the MOU on behalf of their respective organization. According to the memorandum of understanding, LGED, with support from GTZ, will construct Biogas Plants in potential slaughterhouses at different geographic locations of the country. Initially, LGED will collect data of the number of animals actually slaughtered in the slaughterhouses from Pourashava and Upazilas. Then two/three sites would be selected as pilot sites for developing the modality of work. Upon successful completion of the pilot plants, a large scale project would be designed implementation. The plant construction, supervision and monitoring costs would be borne by GTZ, except the local contribution part from the beneficiary. The local committee would operate & maintain the plant and get benefit of gas/electricity and bio-fertilizer. Thus, a part of the local energy demand would be fulfilled.

### LGED to rebuild Aila-torn infrastructure in Satkhira

LGED has proposed for a project to rebuild the Aila-torn infrastructure in Satkhira and rehabilitate the hapless people of the region at a cost of Tk. 15.38 crore. The proposed project is expected to be approved by ECNEC in near future.

It may be recalled here that the devastating cyclone 'Aila' lashed Satkhira, the extreme southern district of Bangladesh adjacent to the Sundarbans, on 25 May 2009 destroying the mileposts of development and kept the people of the region in utter helplessness. The all-engorging cyclone had not only ruined 153.85 kilometers of road built earlier by LGED, but also had caused a havoc on the lives of 65,000 families living in 75 villages of 15 uinions of Shyamnagar and Ashashuni upazila. Besides, agricultural produces and shrimpers' perimeters were badly damaged. Woodcutters, apiculturists and fishermen living around the Sundarbans were acutely affected.

LGED, like other departments of the government, dedicated itself to instantaneous rebuilding and rehabilitation programmes to ease the sufferings of the people caused by Aila devastation. Noted among those programmes were immediate repairing of damaged road connections, construction of 4 new cyclone shelters in Padmapukur and Gabura unions and developing 12 others. The proposed project, when implemented, would hopefully bring smiles of fortune to the dismayed people of the region.

# RTIP's laudable efforts to create job opportunities and cut poverty reduction

[BSS and UNB, two national news agencies of Bangladesh recently carried two separate reports, which were published in the Daily Star dated 26 October 2010. The said reports highlighted LGED's efforts to create job opportunities and reduce poverty reduction through its Rural Transport Improvement Project (RTIP) in 21 districts of the country. Furnished below are the reports as published in the daily.]

A total of 30,000 rural people got jobs in 21 districts of the country in the last seven years under the Rural Transport Improvement Project (RTIP). The project, being implemented by Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) with the financial support of the World Bank (WB), has improved over 2,500 km rural roads and built more than 110 growth market centres,

said a WB statement. A study on the project shows that new rural roads have made it easier for the children to go to school, healthcare facilities are now more accessible and new economic opportunities opened up for villagers. Female employment rate increased by almost 50 percent and nonagricultural assets increased by 25 percent in the project areas compared to the non-project ones. The final socio-economic monitoring and evaluation study conducted last month shows that travel times are now reduced by 58 percent during dry season and 65 percent during monsoon for motorised vehicles. The International Development Association (IDA), the concessionary arm of the World Bank, is funding \$190 million for this project. The Bank has already disbursed more than \$178 million and the rest will be disbursed by June 2011 when the project would end. Encouraged by the success of the project, the World Bank has assured the government of providing \$350 million (concessional credit) for a second phase of the RTPI to continue improvement of rural Economy. (BSS report)

An impact study of World Bank (WB) shows that female employment rate increased by almost 50 percent and non-agricultural assets increased by 25 to 50 percent as a result of the government's Rural Transport Improvement Project (RTIP). Similarly, poverty reduction rate almost doubled in the project areas. New rural roads have made it easier for the children to go to school, health

care facilities are now more accessible and new economic opportunities have opened up for villagers. The WB is supporting the government in 21 districts in improving the rural transport infrastructure. The RTIP, since its inception in 2003, has maintained and improved more that 2,500 km of rural roads and built or improved more than 110 growth market centres and 30 jetties. The project so far created employment for more that 30,000 persons in the project area. The project's impact area covers over 44,000 square km in 21 Districts. (UNB report)
