PM urges all to plant trees and protect mother nature

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina called upon all to plant at least three saplings and nurture those with care to preserve the environment for ensuring a pleasant future for the next generation. She gave the call while inaugurating the World Environment Day, the National Tree Plantation Campaign and Tree Fair-2012 in Dhaka on 5 June 2012. She termed the theme of this year's National Tree Plantation Campaign- 'Green Cities, Green Country, Bangladesh, a country of red and green' as very appealing and time befitting.

The Prime Minister said, her government has taken initiatives to plant saplings on homesteads, fallow and marginal lands, beside roads and railway tracks, riverbanks, newly emerged chars, khas lands, and on the premises of educational institutions.

The Prime Minister also said, Bangladesh is observing the World Environment Day to create mass awareness about the need of preserving environment. This year's theme of the Environment Day- 'Green Economy : Does it include you ?'-is also guite significant, she

The Prime Minister said, the people of Bangladesh, rich with biodiversity, has intense relation with nature. So, to protect the mother nature, we have to check population boom, desertification, hill-cutting, filling of waterbodies, loss of navigability of the rivers, unwise use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides in agriculture, she added.

In observance of the World Environment Day and National Tree Plantation Campaign-2012, LGED along with other organizations had setup a stall at the Tree Fair-2012 to display LGED's environmental issues and highlighted its eco-friendly development activities. LGED emphasizes due attention to environment in their all attempts in identification of schemes and project preparation. Editor's Note

GCC roads augment vibrant rural economy

The growth centre is a rural market. It is the nerve centre of socio-economic and cultural activities in the rural scenario. The village people flock together in the growth centres to sell a variety of commodities including agro products and buy essential ingredients for agricultural yields and household needs. Besides, the villagers discuss matters related to mechanized cultivation and market management there.

The development of market mechanism is essential to facilitate transportation of agricultural products from one place to another, from the growers to the buyers and the beneficiaries. Moreover, employment opportunities for the rural people and sustainable shops would crop up number of traders and agricultural production would go up, the price of essential ingredients for agricultural production would go down, the labourers will enjoy higher wages and the valuation of land would shoot up. It is also essential to develop the growth centres to accelerate the pace of rural economic programmes and to emancipate the rural people from poverty.

In a bid to develop the linkage between the growth centres and the upazila headquarters or the nearby national highway network, LGED constructed growth centre connecting roads measuring about 30,050 km out of 37,822 km and 3,78789 m bridge/culverts out of 4.56.675 m since 1987-'88 till date. Moreover, 7,78,110 m of structure (bridge/culverts) on rural roads have been constructed out of 13,35,938 m. In consequence the rural people are now able to travel and carry their products at ease and in no time to upazila headquarters or to any other place Traffic movement has increased. transport costs have gone down. The rural economy now seems to be agog with positive changes.

Workshop on MSU/UMSU Activities & PPR-2008 for Municipal Mayors held in Rangpur

A day-long workshop on Municipal Support Unit (MSU) and Urban Management Support Unit (UMSU) Activities, and Public Procurement Rules-2008 (PPR-08) was held in Rangpur on 02 June 2012 to raise the awareness of 31 Municipal Mayors coming from Rangpur and Rajshahi regions. Chaired by Mr. Md. Wahidur Rahman, Chief Engineer, LGED the workshop was attended by Mr. Abu Alam Md. Shahid Khan, Secretary, Local Government Division (LGD) as the chief guest.

MSU/UMSU Activities are now being conducted in 10 regions of Bangladesh to develop the institutional capacity building of the municipalities.

He urged upon the Mayors to gear up the revenue collection drive. The Secretary advised the beneficiaries to shun the culture of keeping all sorts of bills pending. Urban planning is very important in the development of a city, the chief guest added. He made an appeal to the Mayors to make an effective urban planning for future ten or twenty years.

LGED to implement Haor Development Project costing about Taka one thousand crore

Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) is set to take up the responsibility of implementing the Haor Area Infrastructure and Lifestyle Development Project, with an outlay of Tk.945 crore. The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC) approved the project on 5 June 2012 at its meeting in Dhaka with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair.

Of the total project cost, it is learnt, Tk.255 crore will come from the government exchequer, while the remaining Tk. 690 crore will be provided by International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) and Spain Trust Fund (STF).

The major components of the project include construction of 100 kms of upazila roads, 150 kms of union roads including submersible roads, 350 kms of community roads including submersible roads, 700 meters of bridges/culverts on upazila roads, 1050 meters of bridges/culverts on union roads, 1600 meters of culverts/bridges on community roads, and construction of a 700 meter bridge in Sunamganj district among other infrastructures.

LGED, UPs sign accord to ensure women's role

The Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) and 20 selected Union Parishads (UPs) of Rajshahi and Naogaon districts signed and agreement on 13 and 14 May 2012 to ensure participation of women UP members in decision making and development activities of rural infrastructure initiatives.

Under the agreement, the selected UPs will create opportunities and congenial work atmosphere for the women in general from their programmes and infrastructure activities. The UPs achieving the "Performance Criteria" as outlined in the agreement will be eligible to avail a grant of US\$ 21,700 for two years.

The selection of 20 pilot UPs followed the criteria set in the TA paper and the UPs were selected on cluster basis to maximize using available resources for improved capacity building support. UPs that received similar support from other programmes were not considered. In addition, the following factors were also considered in selecting the UPs: Performance of the respective chairperson in managing the affairs of the Parishad; responsiveness of the chairperson towards gender related issues; and relationship with local administrative officials.

The agreement was signed under a technical assistance project financed by the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction (JFPR) and administered by the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

Using a performance-based approach, LGED will implement the activities under the project to institutionalize mechanisms to provide benefits to women from rural infrastructure projects. The initiative is a sub-project of the ADB-supported Sustainable Rural Infrastructure Improvement Project (SRIIP), which is being implemented by LGED.

sustainable infrastructures in the area of rural, urban and small scale water sectors throughout the country. To enhance the capacity of planning and monitoring of such type development program in an efficient way, LGED adopted the technological advantages GIS in early 90s. By this time, LGED has developed very strong geo-spatial database covering various layers including administrative boundaries. physical infrastructure, educational institutions, settlement pattern and other agriculture and socio-economic infrastructure. To develop this database, different maps such as: topographic maps, old thana maps, aerial photographs, satellite images etc. were used in LGED. A lot of GPS machines, digitizer boards, Total Stations and GIS software were used to prepare the geo-database which help to prepare all Upazila and District Map of Bangladesh. Recently, our Honorable Prime Minister has released all those maps on LGED website. These GIS maps and geospatial database become essential basic information for project planning and monitoring in LGED. Besides this GIS development work, various land survey equipment are used for different high quality scheme preparation of road, bridge/culvert construction work in LGED.

I conceive, the participants of today's seminar shall put their valuable comments and suggestions on the issue to facilitate a better option on the issue. With my regards and thanks to all, I like to conclude here.
