EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Rangpur City Corporation is A Category City Corporation having 203.19 sq. areas. The ULB is densely populated having 33 administrative wards which is also underserved in all development considerations. The subproject has been selected considering the needs of the locality which is priority as CIP of RCC.

The Social management Plan (SMP) of the Subproject under Rangpur City Corporation was developed through inclusive participation of all level stakeholders and using participatory approach. A total of eight social screening were conducted one for each component. The subproject comprises interventions proposed as per CIP-1 & CIP-4 of the Rangpur City Corporation. The sub project will benefit three of the 33 administrative wards of the RCC (Wards 24, 25 and 27). According to engineering design, implementation of this subproject will be carried out within the existing right-of-way hence no LA is involved and no RAP is required.

Total cost of the subproject is Taka: 161,076,851.03

Main Purposes of the subproject

To improve overall Rangpur City Corporation drainage networks construction 6140 m long drain covered 3 wards. Present condition of drains are discontinuous, brick made, old, largely damaged and narrow, hence water discharged capacity is low. During the rainy season, water logging takes place all over the proposed areas.

Anticipated Impacts:

The subproject will benefit three of the 33 wards of the RCC. About 1, 20,500 people of the three wards will be benefited for improved drainage.

A total of 59 boundary wall/fence of private houses and four farming plots will be affected. The PAPs are encroachers. They have agreed in writing to remove obstacles willingly and without compensation. In addition, the subproject will need shifting of 116 electric poles and 17 T & T poles.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Project Background

The Government of Bangladesh, through the Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) and Bangladesh Municipal Development Fund (BMDF) is implementing the Municipal Governance and Services Project (MGSP). The project aims to improve municipal governance and basic urban services in participating ULBs. Two physical components of the project include (i) Municipal Governance and Basic Urban Services Improvement (Component 1) to provide financial support to 26 pre-identified urban local bodies (ULBs) comprising 22 municipalities and four city corporations, and demand-based sub-credits to eligible ULBs for basic urban services improvement investment costs (component 2). Total project cost is BDT 2, 470, 93.92 lakh to be financed at 80:20 IDA loan to GOB contribution. LGED is implementing the Component 1 while BMDF is implementing component 2 of the project.

LGED is supporting the 26 pre-selected ULBs for investments in development and rehabilitation of Road, Bridge, Box-culvert, pedestrians bridge, street light, Road Safety, Bus terminal, Truck terminal, Boat landing Jetty, Drain, Retaining wall, Kitchen market, Cattle market, slaughter house, Public toilet, Solid waste management, Sweeper colony, Park, Community Centre and Whole sale market. LGED is financing through (i) base allocation based on population category of ULBs; (ii) performance-based allocation and (iii) operations and maintenance support on a declining basis over the project period.

The component interventions have largely been developed for construction and rehabilitation within existing available land owned by the ULBs and acquisition of land has been avoided in the screening process. Removal of some obstruction and relocation of some businesses were involved in case of some sub projects for unavoidable circumstances. The MGSP did not avoid taking-up of sub projects in areas inhabited by tribal peoples and instead ensured their inclusion and participation where applicable. The ULBs addressed the removal of obstructions and in most cases the land entirely belongs to the ULB. In some instances, land of other GOB agencies like the BWDB, R&H, Railway or other local government like adjoining UP is needed and in such cases the ULB ensured getting such land by mutual understanding and proper documentation of such understanding. Relocation of business and removal of obstructions were resolved by consultation and agreement with the concerned PAPs and these are properly documented. Thus land acquisition, population displacement and tribal people's issues have been addressed following the country's legal framework and the World Bank policy on social safeguards.

1.2 Legal and Policy Framework

Given the approach of subproject preparation and implementation, the World Bank's Operational Policy (OP) on Involuntary Resettlement (OP 4.12) and on Indigenous Peoples (OP 4.10) triggered to the project. A Social Management Framework (SMF) has been adopted by LGED for the project that meets the requirements of the country's legal frameworks in Bangladesh "The Acquisition and Requisition of Immovable Property, Ordinance, 1982" and the Bank requirements including OP 4.12 and OP 4.10. The SMF also requires that subprojects are prepared ensuring inclusion, participation, transparency, and social accountability. Subprojects are prepared by respective ULBs in a process complying with the SMF requirements. LGED reviews the subproject proposals for technical, engineering, environmental, social development, and safeguards compliance before allocation of the financing to the ULBs.

Social Management Plans (SMP) will be prepared and implemented for subprojects with no land acquisition or involuntary displacement of people, while Resettlement Action Plans (RAP) and

Tribal Peoples Plans (TPP)) will be prepared for implementation for subprojects involving population displacement and tribal peoples' issues.

1.3. Brief Description of Subproject

Brief Description of Subproject

a) Construction of RCC drains at Azaz Nagor Colony (Ch. 0+000-0+385 km. &Ch. 0+000-0+415 Km. Total length 800 m.

This sub project is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward **number 27.** The proposed alignment starts from Anti-Corruption Commission Rangpur office and ends nearNagor Colony (Ch. 0+000-0+385 m &Ch. 0+000-0+415 m). The existing road is a BC road. The drain will be constructed on one side of the road and will have a crossing over inter colony road. The existing drain is brick and earthen, it is old and damaged and water discharge capacity is very low. The required land of road and drain belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. Its outfall is the main drain constructed by JICA.

The component requires dismantling boundary wall of 5 private houses (Ch.0 to 385 m) will be as they encroached to city corporation land. The 5 PAPs have signed an agreement with the RCC saying that they will removed the obstacles willingly and without compensation for interest of City Corporation's development works and for their own benefits and getting better business environment. Construction of the component also needs shifting 18 electrics poles and cutting of3 trees (Pump tree and coconut)

b)Construction of RCC drain from station road to Guptapara road (Ch.0+000 -1 +100km including Link- 1, length 100 m ,link-2 length 70m,link -3, length 210m ,link -4, length 200m, link-5, length 180 m & link -6 , length 200m. Total length 2060m.

This sub project is an important work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 25. The proposed alignment starts from station road (near Rangpur Press Club) and ends at Guptapara. It's total length 2060 m. The existing road is a BC road. Both sides of the road have spaces for construction of proposed one side drain and cover slab. The required land of drains belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

Under the component, a new RCC drain will be constructed on one side of the road and it has seven crossings of local roads of the RCC. Also, it has six link drains like link- 1 adjacent to S.A printer(Ch. 200 m), link-2 in JL road(Ch. 320 m), link-3 isJL road (Ch.605m), link-4 is CS Road(Ch. 760 m), link-5 is CS road(Ch. 80 m) and link-6 in CS road(Ch. 960 m)

The existing drain is made of brick wall and its alignment is discontinuous. It is old, damaged and its water discharge capacity is inadequate. The outfall of the drain is Shamashunorikhal.

During social screening the DSM team hasseen some obstacles as following:

- Link -5 will require removing 3 boundary walls of private houses. The PAPs signed agreement with the RCC to remove the obstacles willingly and without compensation (Agreement with PAP,s attached annex-1)
- The sub project needs shifting 44 electric poles, 08 T &T poles and cutting of 2 trees (Mango & Date Tree)

c) Construction of RCC drain from Shahipara road (Ch. 0+000-0+380 m).

This component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 24. The proposed drain is located at Shahipara (Ch. 0+000-0+380 m). The existing road is bituminous carpeting road. There is no drain from Ch. to 200m and rest portion of drains is old and damaged and have poor water discharging capacities. New drain is proposed on one side of the road. The proposed drain will have two road crossings of local road of the RCC. The crossings are at ch 0 and ch 280. Required land of road and proposed drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation. The outfall of the drain is existing JICA drain.

During social screening DSM team has seen some obstacles as following:

One shop (Ch. 0) will be affected as the extended front space which is pucca brick wall is encroached to the city corporation road. This shop belongs to the City Corporation and the tenant made extended part. From Ch. 75 m to 180m the subproject will need removal of boundary walls of 10- private houses encroached to City corporation land. These obstacles were removed with discussion of PAPs. (Agreement with PAPs attached annex-1) The sub project also needs shifting 05 existing electrics poles.

d) Construction of RCC drain from Milonir moar to Shamashundori Canal (Ch. 0+00-0+500 km

This component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 25. The proposed alignment starts from Milionir moar and ends at Shamashundori culvert (near Shree Shree ProboGogoSheabaShoram (Temple) (Ch. 0+00-0+500m). The existing road width is 3 .5 to 4 m and is a bituminous carpeting road. Both sides of the road have enough spaces for construction of proposed drains and cover slab. The required land of road & drain belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation.

The new RCC drain construction is proposed on one side of the road. Its outfall is at Shamashundori canal. This proposed drain has 5 crossings of intra-town roads. From Ch. 0 to 200there is narrow brick drain and rest part has no drain.

During social screening DSM team has seen some obstacles as following:

- At starting point of proposed subproject will requiring removing about 17boundary walls of private houses. These walls were extended in city corporation land as encroached. These PAPs will remove their boundary walls willingly and without any compensation.(Agreement with PAPs attached annex-1)
- The sub project needs shifting 21 electrics and 07 T & T poles and cutting of 5 trees (Betel nut and Mango).

e) Construction of RCC drain from Gunjan Moar to Tatipara road side drain (Ch.0+000-1+000 m)

This component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 25. The proposed alignment starts from Gunjon moar (JL Roy Road) and ends at Tatipara road (Ch.0+000-1+000 m). The existing road is a bituminous carpeting road. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

The new RCC drain construction is proposed along one side of the road. The proposed drain has two crossings of intra town roads at Ch. 350 m & 400m. The existing drain is discontinuous, brick made and old. Its drainage capacity is very low. Its outfall is at Milonir moar to Shamashundori cannel drain.

During social screening the DSM team has seen some obstacles as following:

This construction will requiring removing about 17 private house boundary wall and also will be affected as encroached to the city corporation land. These PAPs agreed to remove obstacles willingly and without any compensation(Agreement with PAPs attached annex-1).

The componentalso needs shifting 08 electric poles and 2- T & T poles.

f)Construction of RCC drain at Mayamayi Road (Ch. 0+000-0+ 550 m)

This component is an important work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number **24**. The proposed alignment starts from Shahipara (south of JICA drain) and ends at Mayamayi (north JICAdrain) road (Ch.0+000-0+550 m). The existing road is bituminous. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation. The proposed new RCC drain is a one side drain and its outfall is existing JICA drain.

This construction will require removing 5boundary walls and tin-fences of private housesandwill affect 4 farmers (Ch. 130 to 550 m). The walls and fences are encroached to RCC road and the four owners extended their farm land to RCC land by encroachment. The nine PAPs agreed to remove obstacles/ vacate the land willingly and without compensation as per agreement with the RCC(Agreement with PAPs attached annex-1). This also needs shifting 05 electrics poles and cutting of 77 trees (Mango, Jackfruit and betel nut).

The component includes provision of street light in the above mentioned proposed road which will improve pedestrian's safety, will improve overall visibility for the vehicle drivers and thereby will contribute to reducing accident. This will have positive contribution to volume of trade in the nearby market.

g) Construction of RCC drain at Kharampotti road (Ch.0+000-0+500 km)

This component is an important work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 25. The

proposed alignment starts from Guptapara (new south JICA drain and ends Kharampotti road (Ch.0+000-0+500 m). The existing road width is 3.5 to 4 m and it is bituminous carpeting road. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

The proposed new RCC drain is a one side's drains in ward 25 and its outfall is Kharampotti existing drain. The outfall drains is open, so bad smell spread over the area. As a result people, particularly women iseases. Local councilor reported that aged peoples and p, it recommended protect the outfall through with cover

slabs.

h) Construction of RCC drain at Bhubosundari road (Ch. +000-0+350 Km)



This is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number **24**. The proposed alignment starts from Indira moar (Begum Rekey Monument) and ends new JICA drain (Near Fire Services office Ch.0+000-0+350 m). The existing road width is 4 to

4.5 m and it is a bituminous carpeting road. The road has discontinuous side-drain. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

Presently, there is no proper drainage system. Due to discontinuous of drains, the storm water enters nearby houses and floods the road. So, implementation of this sub project is very much important for Rangpur City Corporation.

During social screening DSM team did not find any obstacles affecting any house or shop etc. However, the subproject needs shifting 09 electrics poles.

The proposed subproject and its estimated costs are given in the following table.

1.4 Social Management Plan

This Social Management Plan (SMP) has been prepared for the identification and managing social concerns in the process of subproject design and implementation. Initially, each subproject component included a social screening report. After reviewing the social screening report by Social Unit of DSM, this subproject proposal is submitted to the PMU office. Social team of the DSM has carried out a site visit and consulted with the Rangpur City Corporation officials, stakeholders (down to the ward level) and cross section of the beneficiary communities through interview, participation and consultation meeting. The social screening findings from the

consultation method and proceedings were further validated through the social survey and consultation.

The purpose of preparing this SMP is to demonstrate an all-inclusive consultative process in selection and design of the subproject as well as to provide guidance for social development and safeguards compliance in the implementation process.

The SMP contains a description of the subproject area, social screening and impacts, consultation process adopted during identification and design, and consultation plan for implementation stage, impact mitigation measures, grievance resolution process, and implementation arrangements, and monitoring and evaluation.

RCC authority will ensure participation of the communities and grievance resolution in the process of implementation of the subprojects.

2. Description of Subproject Area

2.1 Brief Profile of Rangpur City Corporation

Rangpur is one of the major cities of Bangladesh and the main urban area of RangpurDivision.Rangpur was declared a district headquarters on 16 December 1769, and established as a municipality in 1869, making it one of the oldest municipalities in Bangladesh. The municipal office building was erected in 1892 under the precedence Raja JanakiBallav Sen, Chairman of the municipality. In 1890, the "Shyamasundorikhal" was excavated for improvement of drainage facility in the town.

The RCC is located in the north western Rangpur division of Bangladesh. A Recently established public university of Bangladesh named "Begum Rokeya Universityis located in the southern part of the city. Previously, Rangpur was the headquarters of *Greater Rangpur* district. Later the Greater Rangpur district was broken down into the Rangpur, Kurigram, Nilphamari, Lalmonirhat, and Gaibandha districts. In the great Rangpur region, little

Formerly a district town, Rangpur is now the divisional headquarters comprising eight districts of greater Rangpur and Dinajpur in the northwestern part of the country. Rangpur division was created in 2010 and it has been a City Corporation since 2012. Despite being a divisional city, Rangpur is still a rural town. Until mid-1990s when the Jamuna bridge was constructed, very little economic development took place around it, mainly because of the yearly flooding which still remains a constraint to development.

Rangpur City, covering an area of around 203 square kilometers, lies on the bank of the river Ghaghat. Population of the Rangpur municipality as of 2011 is 579,012 with population density of 2,815 per sq km. Rangpur is an administrative town and has concentration of educational institutions such as newly established Begum Rokeya University and a century old Carmichael College. It has several other educational institutions like Rangpur Government College, Cadet College and Medical College. It has good potential to grow as a city of agricultural industries and a number of large corporations have established such enterprises like ones owned by the PRAN-Group. It has good number of cold storages. Huge number of people from the adjoining rural areas comes to the City Corporation area during the non-working season of agriculture (September-November after the T-Aman crop is planted and from March-April after the boro crop is planted) in search of work. Improvement of this infrastructure under the subproject will increase commercial and economic activities in this area and will also boost other socio-

economic activities in the City Corporation. Moreover, health and sanitation of the local community people will improve.




Figure: 2: Subproject layout plan (PW-10) in Rangpur City Corporation. (b,c,d,e,& f,g h)





Figure: 3: Subproject layout plan (PW-10) in Rangpur City Corporation. (a)



2.2. The Subproject Location and Area Profile

Name of Subproject Components:

- a)Construction of RCC drain at Azaz Nagor Colony (Ch.0+000-0+385km. & Ch.0+000-0+415 Km.Total length 800 m.
- b)Construction of RCC drain from station road to Guptapara road (Ch.0+000 -1 +100 km Including Link- 1, length 100 m, link-2 length 70 m,link -3, length 210m, link -4, length 200m, link-5, length 180 m & link -6, length 200 m. Total length 2060 m
- c) Construction of RCC drain from at Shahipara road (Ch.0+000-0+380m).
- d) Construction of RCC drain from Milonir moar to Shamashundori Canal (Ch. 0+00-0+500 Km
- e) Construction of RCC drain from Gunjan Moar to Tatipara road side drain (Ch. 0+000-1+000 m)

- f) Construction of RCC drain at Mayamayi Road (Ch.0+000-0+ 550m
- g) Construction of RCC drain at Kharampotti road (Ch.0+000-0+500 km)
- h) Construction of RCC drain at Bhubosundari road (Ch. +000-0+350 Km)

The sub project components noted above have several educational institutions, mosques, temples, banks, NGO offices, computer training centers, mosque, temple, CNG stations, warehouse, poultry feed mill and these will all be benefited by the subproject interventions comprising drainage improvement and street light facilities

This subproject benefited areas are mainly residential. The roads to be provided drainage facilities and have a variety of commercial enterprises like grocery shops, beauty parlor, medicine shops, tea stall, restaurant and fast food shop etc.

Various types of vehicles like battery operated three wheeler auto, CNG operated three wheeler baby taxi, tractor trailer, rickshaw,rickshaw van etc. will benefit from the subproject. Also modern vehicles like car, jeep, pick-up, bus and Lorries will be using the road. The pedestrians, particularly women, children, elderly people will use the road more comfortably and safely.

2.3 Historical and Cultural Heritage Sites:

Under the Rangpur City Corporation, there are lots of historical and Archaeological heritage sites from British period to 1971. A few of them are as follows:

Archaeological heritage and relics TajhatRajbari, Keramatia Mosque, Dimlaraj Kali Mandir, Shree ShreeKarunamaye Kali Mandir, Rangpur Museum, Rangpur Town Hall, Rangpur Public Library, PareshnathMandir at Mahiganj, tomb of the noted Islamic thinker MaulanaKeramat Ali Jainpuri, tomb of Shah Jalal Bokheri at Mahiganj, tomb of Ismail Ghazi at Kataduar, carmichael college Building, home stead of roquiah sakhawathossain at Pairabandh and Zila Perished Building etc.

A) Tajhat Palace:

Tajhat Palace is located at Tajhat, the southern end of Rangpur city. The place is situated three km on the south–east outskirts of the town of Rangpur. Probably this place was built by Maha Raja Kumar Gopal Lal Ray in the beginning of the 20th century. The palace was Zamindar house (house of feudal king) and was used as High Court building during 1984 to 1991. In 2004, it was largely renovated and converted to a museum which hosts a collection of Blackstone Hindu carvings, calligraphic art from the Mughal period and other objects d'art and coins from the area on display. The palace was declared as a protected monument by the department of archaeology recognizing its outstanding archaeological value.

B) Raja Man Singh a commander of the Mughal Emperor

Rangpur was conquered by the army of Raja Man Singh a commander of the Mughal emperor, Akbarin 1575, but it was not until 1686 that it was fully integrated into the Mughal Empire. Names of places like Mughalbasa(literal meaning being a locality of the Mughals), and Mughalhat(literal meaning a "local market" organized by the Mughals) bear testimony to the Mughal Association and past of Rangpur and its hinterland. Later on, Rangpur passed under the control of "Sarker" of Ghoraghat. During the period of the British East India Company, the Sannyasi Rebellion took place .Rangapur Ghoraghat has been mentioned in the Riyaz-us-Salatin. During the early period of the company rule fakir-sannyasi resistance and peasant rebellion were held in Rangpur.

C) Carmichael College

Carmichael College is one of the oldest colleges in Bangladesh established in 1916 and built during the Raj era, is located in Rangpur. The main attraction of this college is its administrative building (which houses the Bangla department). It is a white two-storied building designed in the style of the buildings of Cambridge University of UK. It is also familiar with its huge campus and natural beauty.

D) Rokeya Memorial

Rokeya memorial in pairabondh A museum and women's training centre was established in Pairabondh, the birth place of famous Begum Rokeya. It is half an hour drive away from Rangpur city located at village Pairabond in Mithapukur Upazila.

E) Town Hall

There is an ancient auditorium named 'Town Hall' at the centre of the city, where different cultural programs are held.

F) JaduNibash

This is located in Radhaballav next to the Rangpur Government College. This is the Home of Late Mashiur Rahman Jadu Mia. It is an ancient house, about hundred years old. The house was probably built and owned by Raja Gopal LalRaiBahadur at the same time that the Rangpur District Council, Rangpur Town Hall and the famous Tajhat Palace buildings were built.

G) Rangpur Zoo

Rangpur Central Zoo is one of the main amusement and recreation spot of Rangpur city. With an area of 20.27 acre of lush green trees and grasses, the Rangpur zoo is located east side of Hanuman-tola road beside police-line, not far from Rangpur district Administration office. The Zoo has 193 individual animals of 28 species. Many wild animals are available to attract the visitors. A few of them are The Bengal tiger, African lion, Black Panther, Rhinoceros, Leopard, Hippopotamus, Peacocks, Alligators, Turtles, Spotted Deer, different kinds of Birds, Snakes and so on.

The Rangpur zoo was built in the 1989 and opened for visitors in 1992. Bangladesh University of Engineering Technology (BUET) completed a digital survey and feasibility study of "Dhaka andRangpur Zoo Modernization Project" to upgrade the facilities to international

standard.

H) BinodonUddyan

"BinodonUddyan" is a massive park located in the middle of the city. A Shishu Park (children's park), lake and a large restaurant are situated inside of this park. The mini Tajmahal also latest attraction.

I) Deowan Bari Jamindaar Bari

The Deowan Bari Jamindaar Bari was built by FoniBhusonMojumdar. FoniBhusonMijumdar was the son of Landlord Radharomon and mother KusumKumari Devi who was the second wife of Radharomon. He was born in 1892. This landlord house is a small 2 storied building. but the main gate of the house is like a Mughal Castle – gate. After ban of the Real estate tenancy practices in 1952 the house was auctioned. The property was purchased by one NosorGhatial who hailed from Kurigram. Now there is a school and some business centers. It is located at Deowan Bari road in Rangpur near the town.

J) Chiclivata

Near the stadium, there is a very beautiful place called 'Chiclivata' surrounding by many lakes and rice fields.

2.4 Beneficiary Communities and Affected Persons

The proposed drains will help improving road condition and remove water logging. As a result people will be able to move easily during the rainy season. Local transports like rickshaw, rickshaw van, battery driven three wheeler auto and CNG driven baby taxi and diesel operated tractor trailers (Bhotbhoti) will move conveniently besides buses, covered van, cars, micro buses, pickup van and other local transports.

This part of the town is quickly growing residential cum commercial area. About 1,20,500 people will be benefited by the subproject infrastructure drain. They will use the drains to meet the needs of job holders, students, children & women. People of three wards will (24, 25& 27) mainly benefit from the sub project. In addition, people of other wards of the town and the adjoining others wards will use the drains. The proposed drains will reduce overall town water logging situation with the connection of master drains networks system.

This is very densely populated area. It is noted here that there is no presence of tribal people in the subprojects influence areas.

2.5. Gender and Vulnerability

Gender and vulnerability analysis have been considered in social impact assessment of subprojects. This has focused gender and vulnerability based on findings from specific queries during social screening and community consultation. The quantitative and qualitative analysis has brought out sex disaggregated data and issues related to discrimination by gender vulnerability, needs, constraints, and priorities as well as understanding whether there is a potential for inequitable risks, benefits and opportunities relating to gender and vulnerability. Based on the social analysis, specific interventions inclusion and participation encourages gender mainstreaming in the project cycle. Gender equity and empowerment will be ensured through encouraging participation of men and women equitably in the project

cycle. The community participation and consultation also encourages gender mainstreaming in the subproject influence areas.

After subprojects implementation, there are positive impacts for the vulnerable women; especially those who are small traders, landless, marginal farmers, etc. and can sell their household products. These subprojects will create job creation and livelihoods. In addition, it will also increase the mobility of drains users. Due to the fact, gender and vulnerability has been taken into account and ensures the gender equity in the subprojects implementation.

3. Social Impact Assessment

3.1 Benefits of the Subproject

After identification of subproject through CIP, PMU of the project with the assistance of DSM Consultants has completed social screening and socio-economic impact assessment for the r, drain and cover slab of Rangpur City Corporation. This subproject is predominantly used for inter-town and intra-town movement. It will improve traffic network and drainage system, reduce water logging and improve stability of the road at lower maintenance cost. From the point of view of social benefits it will enhance commercial/economic activities, direct/indirect employment opportunity and poverty reduction. Also it will improve access to health service, educational institution. For improved transport network, property value of adjoining area will increase substantially, rent will increase and this will eventually contribute to increased revenue earning for the City Corporation. In the three wards of the RCC, the subproject interventions will benefit about 1, 20,500 people which is about 10% of the city population as of 2011.

3.2 Social Screening and Safeguard Compliance Issue

After selection of the subprojects from the CIP list, the City Corporation with the assistance of DSM Consultants has completed a social screening for the subprojects using an inclusive and participatory approach.

Rangpur City Corporation has ensured the implementation of subprojects followingsocially inclusive and gender friendly. According to engineering design, implementation of the subprojects will be carried out within the existing right-of-way.

Results from the social screening are given below.

- No additional public or private lands will be required for the subprojects outside the existing right of way.
- The sub project will not affect access to common property resources for any community. It
 will also have no negative impact on cultural property of any kind.
- Preparation of RAP will not be required for implementing the subproject as no LA is involved.
- Agricultural or industrial productivity will be enhanced by the proposed subproject.
- The outcomes of social screening also confirmed that local people across the subprojects are positive about its implementation.
- Boundary wall or fence of a total of 59 houses and crop production of four farmers will be affected. The owners of the house and farm land encroached to the RCC road area to increase their plot size and agreed in writing to remove obstacles and vacate the encroached area willingly and without compensation.

4. Consultation and Community Participation

4.1 Stakeholder Analysis

According to BBS 2011, (Collected from Municipal Authority) the total population of Rangpur City Corporation was 579,012 among which 295,395 are male and 283,617 are female. People belonging to all income groups- living in higher, higher-middle, lower-middle, and lower income groupsin the City Corporation area will benefit from the subproject interventions. Both males and females living in the Rangpur City Corporation and adjoining rural areas will be directly benefited by the construction RCC drains and provision of street light.

As a part of the overall assessment, the subprojects identified the key stakeholders of the proposed subprojects areas and assessed the power relationships as well as influence and interests of stakeholders involved in the development work of the subprojects. Key stakeholders for subprojects under MGSP were identified in consultation with the Mayor and officials of Rangpur City Corporation, civil society and local people of towns, representatives of business associations, and local contractors etc. Suggestions and direction of all local stakeholders were noted and reflected in the SMP while designing subproject interventions.

4.2 Consultation and Participation plan for subproject

Participatory public consultations were conducted in the subprojects area. Key Informant Interviews (KII) and Group Discussion (GD) were conducted involving the participants of Rangpur City Corporation Mayor, Councilors, City corporation officials, representatives of local communities and civil society members as well as representative of local LGED office and consultant team.

A walk-through informal group consultation with the local communities was also held. Through this participation and consultation meeting, the local communities were informed about subprojects implementation and benefits. Suggestion and recommendations made by the participants are incorporated in the SMP accordingly.

4.3. Consultation Outcomes – Issues, Concerns, and Recommendations

The participants raised their issues related to subprojects improvement which mainlyRCC drains. Feedback, suggestions and recommendations by the participants are listed below.

- Construction works should be scheduled properly and the quality of construction work should be maintained strictly.
- By engaging female labor force gender issues will been partially addressed together with ensuring their participation in project design, implementation and monitoring stages.
- Social safeguard compliance issues will be enhanced and ensured through inclusive participation of subprojects beneficiaries in subprojects implementation.
- Any problem arising out of labor influx will be carefully seen by the ULB and mitigation measures taken.

5. Social Management for site Selection and design.

5.1. Subproject Selection Process

MGSP in coordination with concerned Rangpur City Corporation elected functionaries, local administration, relevant stakeholders, community members, road users and civil society members followed the participatory approach in different stages of subprojects selection following inclusion, consultation and participation methods. Female Ward Councilors participated actively in the selection process. Moreover, the representatives of TLCC and WC from the City Corporation have contributed in the subprojects selection process with an analysis of the inclusiveness of the selection process.

At the time of selecting these subprojects, Social Screening and Group Discussion (GD) with Rangpur City Corporation urban communities, local administration, traders, buyers, and sellers were conducted by the Rangpur City Corporation officials and Consultants from DSM. Views and opinions of these consultations were to explain the subproject objectives and sought feedback from the participants to maximize the social and economic benefits as well as to minimize the adverse impacts of the subprojects.

5.2. Subproject Design Process

After final selection of the subprojects, the DSM Consultant designed the proposed subproject (Drains) under Rangpur City Corporation. These subproject components will be constructed using City Corporation's own land. Despite the inclusion and participatory consultations, if any person has a grievance relating to the implementation of the subprojects, the City Corporation will mitigated it.

The Consultant interviewed stakeholders and beneficiaries of the subprojects areas before the design. The Consultant and City Corporation officials conducted a number of consultation meetings in the subprojects areas discussing the implementation procedures and mitigation measures, if any, required to be taken in implementing the proposed subproject.

5.3 Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM):

GRM had already operationalized for Rangpur City Corporation. Accordingly, this City Corporation has formed Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) to handle any grievance raised due to implementation of the subprojects. The committee is headed by the Mayor of the City Corporation and consists of total 7 members. The committee will resolve subproject-related issues, answer to queries and address complaints and grievances about any irregularities in application of the guidelines adopted for assessment and mitigation of social and environmental impacts. Based on consensus, the procedure will help to resolve issues/conflicts amicably and quickly without resorting to any expensive, time-consuming legal actions. It will ensure proper presentation of complaints and grievances, as well as impartial hearings and transparent decisions.

Rangpur City Corporation has already appointed focal Point of GRC who is at the level of Assistant Engineer. But he will also act Social Development Officer for the MGSP subprojects implementation in their City Corporation. The Mayor of the Rangpur City Corporation is the Chairman of the GRC. This GRC at the City Corporation level is responsible to disclose the subprojects implementation before civil works starts.

5.4 Implementation Arrangement: DSM has initially completed social screening for the subprojects and there is no problem for implementing the subprojects regarding social safeguard issues. Accordingly, PMU, MGSP has issued the award letter against the subproject following all required procurement procedures. Rangpur City Corporation has the responsibility to implement the subprojects timely in close coordination with the PMU of the project and also with the technical assistance of DSM. Engineering section of City Corporation and local representative of Consultancy team will ensure the quality construction work of the subprojects. In addition, Consultant team from Head Quarters DSM will ensure close monitoring of the implementation of the subproject components. In the implementation process, Social Safeguard Team will ensure monitoring of social safeguard management before civil works start. During construction, the communities will not be affected and the project will minimize the loss of communities. In addition, before civil works start, the Rangpur City Corporation will make the video filmed and also social screening.

6. Conclusions on Social Management Plan (SMP)

The subproject will improve drainage system in three wards of the RCC providing more convenient and stable road connectivity in the RCC area and with the adjoining rural areas. About 1,20,500 people of three wards and many others of adjoining areas will be benefited. Implementation of the subproject will need removal of boundarywall and tin-fences of 59 private houses and vacating four plots of crop land.

An agreement has been signed with these PAPs and it is agreed that the PAPs will remove obstacles willingly and without asking for any compensation. It is mentioned that on behalf of 63 PAPs(59 boundary walls & 4 agriculture farmers) have signed an agreement with Rangpur City Corporation saying that they will removed obstacle's willingly and without compensation for their interest of Rangpur City corporation development works and for their own benefits for getting better living environment(Agreement are attached annex-1).

Description of subproject:

a) Construction of RCC drain at Azaz Nagor Colony (Ch.0+000-0+385 km. & Ch.0+000-0+415Km. Total length 800m)

This subproject component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 27. The proposed alignment starts from Anti-Corruption Commission Office, Rangpur and ends at Azaz Nagor Colony (Ch.0+000-0+385m & Ch.0+000-0+415m). The existing road width is 3.5 to 4 m and it is a bituminous carpeting road. The required land for drainage improvement belongs to Rangpur City Corporation. Its outfall is at JICA existing drain. This is a one side drain and it has one road crossing at Aziz nagar colony road. Part of the existing drain is made of brick wall and part of it is earthen. The existing drain is old and damaged and its water discharge capacity is inadequate.

This subproject is located exclusively in residential area. Besides this road, there are several types of shops like grocery shops, stationary shops, beauty parlor and tea stall. Aziz Nagor Colony Government Primary School (GPS) is located beside this road. About 7,500 people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, teachers and services holders will benefit from the use of this road with for improved drainage system.

Various types of transport like, rickshaw-van, CNG driven baby taxi and battery operated three wheeler auto are using this road but poor drainage causes damage to roads very damage to the road very frequently.



Figure 1 Existing drain condition at Azaz Nagor Colony

Moreover movement of pedestrian gets difficult during rainy season due to prolonged water-logging.

During the screening work the DSM and ULB team noted absence of proper drainage system and poor condition of the existing drain. So, implementation of this sub project is very important for Rangpur City Corporation.

During social screening the DSM team has seen obstacles as following:

- The sub project construction will require removing boundary wall/ fence of five private houses (Ch.0 to 385 m) as the owners constructed wall/ fence in the RCC road area by encroachment. These obstacles should be removed.
- To construction of component needs shifting 09 electrics poles and cutting of 3 trees (Pump tree and coconut).

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences.

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened ,hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Group Discussion (GD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the

implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Implementation:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design, the City Corporation and the DSM will identify PAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP. The concerned road and drain site belongs to the City Corporation. There is no need to take other any public agencies (such as BWDB, R&H, Railway etc) for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of City Corporation or of any GOB agencies affected by it.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land of the sub project component belongs to private citizens. However, boundary walls/ fences of five private houses are encroached to the RCC road alignment which needs removal. The PAPs agreed to remove the obstacles willingly and without compensation.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

Social Screening results demonstrate that the subproject component does not affect any business or income source.

The proposed subproject is not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected.

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous, Adhibashi and marginalized population that will be affected during subproject implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibashi or marginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The sub project will have tremendous positive impact on the improvement of drainage in the Aziz colony area directly benefiting about 7,500 people. The proposed drain will be connected to the master drain system of Rangpur city and will reduce water logging. Implementation of the proposed subproject is highly recommended.

The subproject involves dismantling encroached boundary walls/ tin fences of five houses encroached to RCC road alignment. The PAPs agreed to remove obstacles willingly and without compensation.

This sub project component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 25. The proposed alignment starts from station road (Rangpur press club) and ends at Guptapara road. (Total length 2060 m). The existing road width is 3 to 3.5 m and is bituminous carpeting road. Both sides of the road have spaces for construction of proposed one side drain and cover slab. The required land of drains belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

The proposed RCC drain has seven crossing of intra town roads. The proposed drainage system under this component has six 6 link-drains at different sections like link-1 adjacent to S.A printer(Ch. 200m),link-2 in JL road(Ch. 320 m), link-3 is JL road(Ch. 605 m), link-4 is CS Road(Ch.760 m), link-5 is CS road(Ch. 80m) and link-6 is CS road(Ch. 960 m). The outfall of the proposed drainage system is Shamashunori khal.

The existing drain is old, made of brick wall and the alignment is discontinuous. So, its discharge capacity is inadequate.

This subproject component is located exclusively in residential areain the middle part of Rangpur City Corporation. Besides this, the locality hasone cooperative Bank, one Saving Credit Society office, Square Pharmacy medicine Depot, several Boutique houses, S.R parcels service, one NGO office (Lets build a healthy Society), one Computer Training Center, Rangpur Law College, K.Ali Business Management Institute &College, one Dairy Farm, one Girls School& one playground, one mosque and one temple, one women's organization office and several types ofshops like tea stall, fast food, grocery cum stationary shops etc. are located in the area.

About **20,000** people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, Boutique product sellers, teachers and services holders use this road, hence will be benefited by the drainage improvement. Various types of transport like covered van, microbus, and rickshaw-van, CNG driven baby taxi andbattery operated three wheeler auto movement are using this road but the adjacent drain is damaged. It makes movement of pedestrian and vehicles difficult during rainy season due to water-logging.

During social screening the DSM team has seen some obstacles as following:

The Link # 5 will require removing boundary wall of 3- private houses as the extended front steps and wall encroached to the city corporation land. This obstacle should be removed. The sub project needs shifting 17 electrics and 08 T &T poles and cutting of 2 trees (Mango & Date-tree)

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences.

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened ,hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Group Discussion (GD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII).

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Executive Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the

implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Implementation:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design, the City Corporation and the DSM will identifyPAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

The concerned road and drain alignment entirely belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of ULB or any GOB agencies affected by it. Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 LAND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment to the private citizens. However, boundary wall of three houses will be affected as the owners encroached to RCC road alignment. The PAPs agreed in writing to remove the obstacles willingly and without any compensation.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

The proposed subproject component will not affect any business or income sources. It is also not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous, Adhibasiand marginalized population that will be affected during subproject intervention and implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibasi ormarginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The subproject will have tremendous positive impact on the improvement of drainage in the Guptapara area directly benefiting about 20,000. The proposed drain will be connected to the master drain system (connected to Shamasundhori Khal) of Rangpur City and will reduce water logging. Implementation of the proposed subproject is highly recommended.

The subproject involves dismantling encroached boundary walls of 3 private house. The PAPs agreed to remove obstacles willingly and without compensation.

This subproject component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number **24**. The proposed alignment starts from and at ends within the Shahipara (Ch.0+000-0+380 m). The existing road width is 3.5 m and is bituminous carpeting road. The required land of drainage improvement belongs to Rangpur City Corporation. Its outfall is at JL road JICA drain. This is one side drain and it has two road crossing in two different sections (Ch. 0 and 280 m.) Part of the existing drain from Ch. to 200m no drain and rest part of drain is old and damaged and its water discharging capacities is inadequate.

The new RCC drain construction alignment is one side drain besides the road with cover slab

This subproject is located exclusivelyin residentialareas. Besides this, the locality has BSRM steel selling showroom and store, CNG servicing center and several types of shopstea stall & grocery shop. About 3,000 people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, teachers and services holders will

benefit from the use of this road with for improved drainage system. Various types of transport like, microbus, rickshaw-van,

CNG driven baby taxi andbattery operated three wheeler auto movement are using this road but poor drainage causes damage to road very damage to the road very frequently. Moreover movement of pedestrian gets difficult during rainy season due to prolonged water-logging.

During the screening work the DSM and ULB team noted absence of proper drainage system and poor condition of the existing drain. So,implementation of this sub project is very much important for RangpurCity Corporation.

During social screening the DSM team has been seen obstacles as following.

- The sub project construction will require removing boundary wall of ten private house (Ch. 75 m to 180m) as the owners constructed wall in City corporation road area by as encroachment. These obstacles should be removed.
- To construction of component needs shifting 05 existing electrics poles.

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences.

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened ,hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Focus Group Discussion (FGD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the Rangpur City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

Rangpur City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Interventions:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design, the City Corporation and the DSM will identify PAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

The concerned road and drain alignment entirely belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of ULB or any GOB agencies affected by it. Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment to the private citizens. However, boundary wall of three houses will be affected as the owners encroached to RCC road alignment. The PAPs agreed in writing to remove the obstacles willingly and without any compensation.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

The proposed subproject component will not affect any business or income sources. It is also not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous; Adhibashiand marginalized population that will be affected during subproject intervention and implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibashi ormarginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The sub project will have tremendous positive impact on the improvement of drainage in the Shahipara area directly benefited about 3,000. The propose drainage will be connected to the JL road JICA main drainage system of the city and will reduce water logging. Implementation of the propose subproject is highly recommended.

The subproject involves dismantling encroached boundary wall and side wall of ten houses. The PAPs agreed to remove obstacles willingly and without compensation.

This sub project component is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number **25**. The proposed alignment starts from Milionirmoar and ends at Shamashundori culvert (near Shree Shree Probo Gogo SheabaShoram (Temple) (Ch. 0+00-0+500m). The existing road width is 3 .5 to 4.5 m and is bituminous carpeting road. The required land of drainage improvement belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. Its outfall is at Shamashundori canal. Both sides of the road have enough spaces for construction of proposed drains and cover slab.

The new RCC drain construction alignment is proposed only one side drain of the mentioned roads side inward 25. This is one side drain and it has five crossing in different locations of intra town area.



The existing drain is old,damaged and narrow One the other hand from Ch.0 to 200 have no drain but existing road is comparatively better. The existing old drains are poor and damaged and water discharge capacity is inadequate. The subproject area is located exclusivelyin residential area of Rangpur City cooperation. Besides this road there are the locality several types of shops like medicine shops, tea stall, fast food & restaurants Jasim

school, Eidgha field, one Masjid and one Hindus temple are located here. About 10,500 people comprising businessmen, students, children and women, agricultural product sellers, teachers and services holders use this road with the improved drainage system. Various types of transport like trolley, microbus, rickshaw-van, CNG driven baby taxi andbattery operated three wheeler auto movement are using this road but poor drainage cause damage to roads very damage to the road very frequently.

Moreover movement of pedestrian gets difficult during rainy season due toprolonged water-logging. During the screening work the DSM and ULB team noted absence of proper drainage system and poor condition of the existing drain. So the implementation of this sub project is very much important for Rangpur City Corporation.

During social screening the DSM team has seen obstacles as following.

The sub project construction will require removing boundary wall of 17 private house as the owners constructed wall in the RCC road area by encroachment. These obstacle should be removed by Rangpur City Corporation. The sub project needs shifting 21 electrics and 07 T & T poles and cutting of 5 trees (Betel nut and Mango).

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences.

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened ,hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Focus Group Discussion (FGD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Executive Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the Rangpur City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the

implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

Rangpur City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, and businessmen, NGOs, social workers and civil society members.

7. Subproject Interventions:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design,the Rangpur City Corporation and the DSM will identify PAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment belongs to private citizens. The concerned road belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of ULB or any GOB agencies affected.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

Social Screening results demonstrate that boundary wall of six private housel will be affected requiring dismantling pucca extended front space. The owners of the house are agreed to remove the obstacles willingly and without compensation. The City Rangpur City Corporation will deal this issue by negotiated settlement

.The proposed subproject is not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous, Adhibashiand marginalized population that will be affected during subproject intervention and implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibashi ormarginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The sub project will have tremendous positive impact on the improvement of the overall drainage system. For the sub project area, it will have safely connect with the main outfall of the city. It all these will have positive impact on employment, creation of better business environment, marketing of products and promoting education facilities. Also, these factors will have incremental value on socio-economic aspects in general and social aspects in particular. Therefore, implementation of the proposed subproject is highly recommended.

Before floating of tender and the start of construction, the DSM will ensure that the documentation is complete and required social issues are properly addressed.

This subproject component is an important work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number **25** The proposed alignment starts from Gunjon moar (JL Roy Road)and ends at Tatipara road (Ch.0+000-1+000 m). The existing road width is 3 to 3.5 m and is bituminous carpeting road. Both sides of the road have enough spaces for construction of proposed drain besides road with cover slab. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

The new RCC drain construction alignment is proposed along oneside drain inward 25. Its outfall is at Shamashundori cannel drain. This is one side drain and crossed 2 times in different locations on intra town roads. (Ch. 350 m & 400m)

This proposed subproject location have existing brick drains and its alignment is discontinuous, old and damaged and water discharge capacity is inadequate.

This subproject area is exclusively in residential areas. Besides this, the locality has one Masjid and one temple and several types of shops medicine shops, tea stall, fast food & restaurant.

About 5800 people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, product sellers, teachers and services holders will benefit from the use of this road for improved drainage system..Various types of transport like covered van, rickshaw-van, CNG driven baby taxi and motor bike, auto movement are using this road but poor drainage causes damage to roads very damage to the road very frequently.. Moreover movement of

pedestrian gets difficult during rainy season due to prolonged of water-logging.

During screening the DSM and ULB team noted absence proper drainage system and poor condition of existing drains. So the implementation of this sub project is very much important for RangpurCity Corporation.

During social screening seen some obstacle's as per following ways.

- The sub project construction will require removing boundary wall ofv17-private house as the owners constructed wall in the RCC road by encroachment. These obstacle should be removed.
- The sub project needs shifting 08 electrics and 2- T & T poles.

This will have positive contribution to volume of trade and safe life.

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences.

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened, hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Focus Group Discussion (FGD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the Rangpur City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the

implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Interventions:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design he City Corporation and the DSM will identify PAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment belongs to private citizens. The concerned road belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of Rangpur City Corporation or any GOB agencies affected.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

Social Screening results demonstrate that boundary wall of 17- private houses will be affected requiring dismantling. The owners of the private house owner agreed to remove the obstacles willingly and without compensation. The City Corporation will resolve this issue by negotiated settlement

.The proposed subproject is not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

Implementation of the propose subproject is highly recommended.

The sub project involves dismantling encroached boundary walls of 17 private houses. The PAPS agreed to remove obstacles willingly and without compensation.

It outfall is at JICA drainThe existing road width is 3.5 to 4 m and is bituminous carpeting road. Both sides of the road have enough spaces for construction of drain and cover slab. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

In this proposed sub project location semi ubrban area and there is no drainbesides the road and existing road is better and well structured. From the Ch. 0 to 130m have paddy land and agricultural field and restarea are exclusively residential area.

This subproject area is (Ch. 130 to 550m) and residential area of the Rangpur city corporation. Besides this, the locality has onemasjid and one

Government Primary school and less number ofshops like tea stall, fast food & restaurants are located here. About 6,000 people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, agricultural product sellers, teachers and services holders use this road with for improved drainage system. Various types of transportlike motor bike, rickshaw-van, CNG driven baby taxi and battery operated three wheeler auto movement are using this road but the road condition is comparatively better. Moreover movement of pedestrian gets difficult during rainy season due to prolonged water-logging. At this time there is no proper drainage system due to absent of drains, the storm water easily entered the house. This is why community peoples faced unsafe situation. So the implementation of this sub project is very much important for RangpurCity Corporation.

During social screening DSM team had seen some obstacles as per following ways.

- The sub project construction will requiring removing boundary wall of five private houses (Ch. 130 to 550m) and 4-farmers will be affected as the extendedwalls and crop field are encroached to the city corporation land.
- The sub project needs shifting 05 electrics poles and cutting of 77 trees (Mango, Jackfruit and betel nut).
- . This will have positive contribution to volume of trade in the nearby markets.

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened, hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Focus Group Discussion (FGD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Interventions:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design, the ULB and the DSM will identifyPAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment belongs to private citizens. The concerned road belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of Rangpur City Corporation orany GOB agencies affected.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

Social Screening results demonstrate that boundary wall of 12- private house will be affected requiring dismantling. The owners of the private house owner agreed to remove the obstacles willingly and without compensation. The City Corporation will resolve this issue by negotiated settlement

.The proposed subproject is not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous, Adhibashiand marginalized population that will be affected during subproject intervention and implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibashi or marginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The sub project will have positive impact on the improvement of drainage in the Mayamayi Road area directly benefiting about 6000. The propose drain will be connected to the JICA master drain system of the city and will reduce water logging .Implementation of the propose subproject is highly recommended.

The sub project involves dismantling encroached boundary walls of five private houses. And 4 agricultural farmers also encroached in city corporation land. The PAPS agreed to remove obstacles willingly and without compensation.

This subproject component is an important work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number 25. The proposed alignment starts from Guptapara (new south JICA drain and ends Kharampotti road (Ch.0+000-0+500 m). The existing road width is 3.5 to 4 m and is bituminous carpeting road. Both sides of the road have enough spaces for construction of one side drain and cover slab. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

The proposed new RCC drain alignment is one side's drains inward 25 and its outfall is Kharampotti existing drain. The outfall drains is open and no cover slabs, so dirty smell spread over the para. As a result children and women's attacked various water borne disease and general mass felt unsafe situation. Local councilor reported that aged peoples and children can't pass the road easily. So recommended protect the outfall through cover slabs.

In this proposed sub project location is totally urban residential densely populated area. Besides the road the existing road is better but drain is poor damaged and less water discharge capacities.

Besides this, the locality has less number of shops tea stall, fast food & restaurants are located here. About 4500 people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, homemade product sellers, teachers and services holders use this road with improvement drainage system. Various

types of transport like motor bike, rickshaw-van, CNG driven baby taxi and battery operated three wheeler auto movement are using this road but poor drainage causes to road very much damaged to the road very frequently. Moreover movement of pedestrian gets difficult during rainy season due to prolonged water-logging.

During screening session DSM & ULB has seen there is no proper drainage system due to poor, damaged & narrow of drains system the storm water easily entered the house. This is why community peoples faced unsafe situation. So the implementation of this sub project is very much important for Rangpur City Corporation.

During social screening DSM team does seen no obstacles the sub project needs shifting 06 electrics poles.

This will have positive contribution to volume of trade in the nearby markets and creates safe living environment.

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened ,hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Focus Group Discussion (FGD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Interventions:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design, the ULB and the DSM will identifyPAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment belongs to private citizens. The concerned road belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of Rangpur City Corporation orany GOB agencies affected.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

Social Screening results demonstrate that there is no obstacles were seen in this proposed subproject area. The proposed subproject is not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous, Adhibashiand marginalized population that will be affected during subproject intervention and implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibashi or marginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The sub project will have positive impact on the improvement of drainage in the Khaarampotti road area directly benefiting about 4500. The propose drain will be connected to the Master MasterDrain system of the city and will reduce water logging .Implementation of the propose subproject is highly recommended.

This sub projectcomponent is an important construction work of Rangpur City Corporation under ward number **24**. The proposed alignment starts from Indira moar (Begum Rokeya Monument) andends at new JICA drain(Near fair services office Ch.0+000-0+350m). The existing road width is 4 to 4.5 m and is bituminous carpeting road. Both sides of the road have enough spaces for construction of drain and cover slab. The required land of drain belongs to Rangpur City Corporation.

The proposed new RCC drain alignment is one side's drains inward 24 and its outfalls at JICA drain and two crossing inter town road (Ch. 100 m & 485 m).

In this proposed sub project there is no drain besides the road and existing road is better and well structured.

This subproject area is residential and mini commercial area of the Rangpur city corporation. Besides this, the locality has fair service office, Begum Rokey Monument, Uttara Motor Show Room, Arrange (Party community center) less number of shops tea stall, fast food & restaurants are located here.

About 3500 people comprising businessmen, students, children, women, product sellers, teachers and services holders use this road with for improved drainage system. Various types of transportlike motor bike, rickshaw-van, Truck, micro bus, car, CNG driven baby taxiandbattery operated three wheeler auto movement are using this road but the road condition is comparatively better. Moreover movement of pedestrian gets

difficult during rainy season due to prolonged water-logging.

At this time there is no proper drainage system due to discontinuous of drains, the storm water easily entered the house. This is why community peoples faced unsafe situation. So the implementation of this sub project is very much important for RangpurCity Corporation.

During social screening DSM team doesn't seen obstacles but needs shifting 09 electrics poles.

This will have positive contribution to volume of trade in the nearby markets and creates safe living environment.

2. INTRODUCTION:

This screening will enable best effective assessment of social issues concerning the subproject component and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual information. This screening also enabled the best effective assessment of social matters in the level and it has been completed as accurately as possible based on factual evidences

3. OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The primary objective of this Social Screening is to check that relevant social issues are properly identified are remedial measures indicated so that sub projects involving unmanageable social risks are screened ,hence the PMU can decided which ones to include or exclude which ones should have further documents prepared like SIMP

4. STRATEGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING:

The Social Screening is based on a collection of primary data and information while conducting field survey for the subproject. A well-structured questionnaire was already designed in the Social Management Framework and given to the field officials for obtaining necessary primary data relating to social issues in connection with losses of land and any kind of assets for the subproject implementation. Further information was obtained through field visits and interviews with relevant stakeholders to capture collective opinions and feedback by using "Focus Group Discussion (FGD)" and "Key Informant Interviews (KII)".

6. METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCREENING REPORT ON SUBPROJECT:

Subproject screening was carried out as per Social Management Framework of MGSP with the use of a prescribed social screening format. The concerned Social Management Officer and Senior Municipal Engineer, Assistant Municipal Engineer and Sub-Assistant Engineer conducted the social screening and the concerned Councilors of the City Corporation participated in it. The screening was based on participatory consultation with the local people using Group Discussion (GD) and Hot Spot (on the spot) consultation with different categories of local people who are aware of local situation and needs of the subproject area.

Focus of the screening includes social safeguard compliance issues such as loses of land, displacement of population, stakeholder participation, income, gender, vulnerability and presence of tribal people etc. The field visit reports on social screening were prepared by the Social Management Officer and the Social Management Specialist has reviewed the reports. The DSM

ensured that nobody in the subproject area will be adversely affected or deprived due to the implementation of the subproject, and the PAPs (if any) are not forcibly evicted. However, it was found that the PAPs agreed to vacate willingly and without compensation.

City Corporation and Consultants jointly ensured the consultation with the communities, infrastructure users, elected public representatives, local administration, teachers, businessmen, NGOs, social workers, and civil society members.

7. Subproject Interventions:

The sub project will take necessary steps regarding implementation of the subproject. Based on design, the ULB and the DSM will identifyPAPs, make their inventory and will produce documentation of agreements on negotiated settlement using legal stamps, where necessary. It is confirmed that RAP will not be required as land acquisition and physical relocation are not involved.

8. KEY FINDINGS

8.1 LAND REQUIREMENTS:

Based on the Social Screening, from the field, it is confirmed that there is no need for land acquisition and preparing RAP.

8.2 HOMESTEAD AND OTHER NON-LAND ASSETS:

It is noticed that no land belongs in the sub project alignment belongs to private citizens. The concerned road and proposed drains sides belongs to the Rangpur City Corporation. There is no land of any public agencies needed for the sub project and there is no leaseholder of Rangpur City Corporation orany GOB agencies affected.

8.3 INCOME LOSS/ BUSINESS LOSS:

.The proposed subproject is not expected to affect any community group's access to any resources that are used for livelihood purpose. None of the cultural heritages are going to be affected

8.4 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE (IP), ADHIBASHI, and MARGINALIZED POPULATION:

There is no Indigenous, Adhibashiand marginalized population that will be affected during subproject intervention and implementation. The survey team did not find any Indigenous, Adhibashi ormarginalized population living besides the sub project.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The sub project will have positive impact on the improvement of drainage in the BhubosunariRoad area directly benefiting about 3500. The propose drain will be connected to the JICA master drain system of the city and will reduce water logging .Implementation of the propose subproject is highly recommended.
