Assignment Title: Cumulative Impact Assessment Consultancy Services for Emergency Multi-Sector Rohingya Crisis Response Project (EMCRP)

The Peoples' Republic of Bangladesh has received financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the Emergency Multi-Sector Rohingya Crisis Response Project (EMCRP), and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services. The consulting services ("the Services") include: (i) Plan and execute an integrated assessment of the cumulative impacts of Forcedly Displaced Myanmar National's camps in Cox's Bazar and related development in the Cox's Bazaar area, including power optimization and development scenarios, (ii) Lead the design of a framework for ongoing co-management with public and private sector in Cox's Bazaar to address identified cumulative impacts, including collaborative environmental and social impact monitoring and management, (iii) strengthen the capacity of DRP influx area stakeholders in CIA and co-management.

Tentative duration of the assignment is 8 months and expected to commence in July 2019.

The Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) now invites eligible consulting firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria are:

- Registration /incorporation of consultants (with supporting documents);
- Back ground of the firm with brochure showing core activities;
- Experience in similar assignments (with assignment & project name, client, funding agency, consultancy cost and duration during last 10 years preferably in Project Data Sheet);
- Availability of professionals with appropriate skills (No CV for individual experts);
- Resources (Turnover) and
- Audited financial reports of last three years.

Key Experts will not be evaluated at the shortlisting stage.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" July 2016 for Borrowers for Goods, Works, Non-Consulting and Consulting Services revised in November 2017 ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.
